as war and terrorism continue to rage over the holy land the temple of jerusalem arguably the most famous sacred structure in world history looms in the background as a symbol of past glory a place of religious worship and a site to be contended over and coveted this book offers a general history of the meaning importance and significance of the temple of jerusalem in both the religious and the political arena it begins with the construction of the temple its destruction in 587 b c e its reconstruction in 516 b c e the vast enlargement during the time of the idumean king herod around 20 b c e its final destruction in 70 c e and its dynamic and abundant afterlife as the leading influence in the construction of jewish synagogues christian cathedrals and islamic mosques but the temple has also been at the center of much political and religious controversy and lundquist explores the issues and conflicts that have erupted over this sacred place considers the meaning and importance of the temple to christianity judaism and islam from ancient times to the present and concludes with a careful consideration of the continuing religious and political tensions on september 28 2000 ariel sharon visited the temple mount also called al haram as sharif in jerusalem igniting what has come to be known as the second intifada but why would such a visit to a religious site set off such a string of violent responses that continue to this day the answer lies in the history of the temple of jerusalem which once indeed twice stood in the spot known today as the temple mount to jews and the dome of the rock to muslims a holy place to three of the world s main religions christianity judaism and islam the temple of jerusalem is arguably the most famous sacred structure in world history and figures prominently in apocalyptic writings yet it is almost entirely absent in all its phases from the archaeological record as the sacred nature of the site prohibits any excavation

in this examination of zion theology and how it arises in the book of psalms antti laato s starting point is that the hebrew bible is the product of the exilic and postexilic times which nonetheless contains older traditions that have played a significant role in the development of the text laato seeks out these older mythical traditions related to zion using a

comparative methodology and looking at biblical traditions alongside ugaritic texts and other ancient near eastern material as such laato provides a historical background for zion theology which he can apply more broadly to the psalms in addition laato argues that zion related theology in the psalms is closely related to two events recounted in the hebrew bible first the architectural details of the temple of solomon 1 kings 6 7 which can be compared with older mythical zion related traditions second the religious traditions related to the reigns of david and solomon such as the ark narrative which ends with david s transfer of the ark to jerusalem 2 sam 6 from this laato builds an argument for a possible setting in jerusalem at the time of david and solomon for the zion theology that emerges in the psalms

this lavishly illustrated volume presents a comprehensive architectural study of 87 individual temples and sanctuaries built in the roman east between the end of the 1st century bce and the end of the 3rd century ce within a broad region encompassing the modern states of syria lebanon israel and jordan religious architecture gave faithful expression to the complexity of the roman east and to its multiplicity of traditions pertaining to ethnic and religious aspects as well as to the powerful influence of imperial rome the source of this power lay in the uniformity of the architectural language the inventory of forms the choice of styles and the spatial layout of the buildings thus while temples have an eclectic character there is an underlying unity of form comprising the podium the stairway between the terminating walls antae and the columns along the entrance front in other words the axiality frontality and symmetry of the temple as viewed from outside the temples and sanctuaries studied in this volume demonstrate individual nuances of plan spatial design location in the sanctuary and interrelations with the immediate vicinity but can be divided into two main categories vitruvian temples derived from hellenistic roman architecture and non vitruvian temples those with plans and spatial designs that cannot be analysed according to architectural criteria such as those defined by vitruvius the individual descriptions presented focus solely upon the analysis of the external and internal space of the temples of all types and do not involve any cultural or ethnic discussion

through an analysis of recently discovered ptolemaic pottery from mut al kharab as well as a reexamination of pottery collected by the dakhleh oasis project during the survey of the oasis from 1978 1987 this book challenges the common perception that dakhleh oasis experienced a sudden increase in agricultural exploitation and a dramatic rise in

population during the roman period it argues that such changes had already begun to take place during the ptolemaic period likely as the result of a deliberate strategy directed toward this region by the ptolemies this book focuses on the ceramic remains in order to determine the extent of ptolemaic settlement in the oases and to offer new insights into the nature of this settlement it presents a corpus of ptolemaic pottery and a catalogue of ptolemaic sites from dakhleh oasis it also presents a survey of ptolemaic evidence from the oases of kharga farafra bahariya and siwa it thus represents the first major synthesis of ptolemaic period activity in the egyptian western desert
